



Vietnam Veterans Memorial of San Antonio

"Hill 881 South"



"Hill 881 South" is a military statue located at the Veterans Memorial Plaza in downtown San Antonio. The sculpture was designed and constructed by Austin Deuel, a Marine Combat artist during the Vietnam War. Radioman PFC Donald Hossack is depicted as the model rendering aid to dying comrade PFC James Randall. It is popular with residents and veterans in the local area and tourists visiting "Military City." Numerous military reunions are held year round in close by hotels. Annual Memorial Day and Veterans Day services are held at the memorial.

The poem "DEATH AT MY DOOR" was penned during the Battle of Hill 881 South, near Khe Sanh, on April 30,1967 in South Vietnam by then 1st Lt. David G. Rogers, who was serving as an artillery forward observer assigned to M/3/3/3. It is inscribed on the base of the memorial and was dedicated to all Marines who were KIA during the battle.

Although depicting an eye-witness event by Austin Deuel during one battle fought by US Marines, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in San Antonio was dedicated in 1986 to all veterans who honorably served our country during the Vietnam War and fought in its many battles.
